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Biography of Speakers



Professor Brin Grenyer

***Chair of the Psychology Board of Australia,
Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency***

Brin Grenyer is a Professor of Psychology, University of Wollongong, Australia and the Foundation Chair of the Psychology Board of Australia overseeing 35,000 psychologists. The Board has developed national standards, codes and guidelines, prosecuted unethical practitioners, approved accreditation arrangements, implemented competency-based national examinations, certified supervisor training, and overseen international recognition of qualifications.

Dr. Sverre L. Nielsen is an authorized psychologist (University of Bergen, 1973). He practices in Clinical Psychology within the field of addiction and was the manager of the first Norwegian Government campaign against drugs. He has been employed full-time in the Norwegian Psychological Association (NPA) as president (8 years), secretary general (10 years) and senior adviser. He holds a number of positions in national and international associations. He is the fellow of ASPPB and IAAP. He chaired the 5th International Congress (participation by invitation only) in Stockholm in July 2013 (which was the start of the “International Project on Competence in Psychology – IPCP”). He was also the chair of the IPCP Work Group.

Dr. Judy Hyde is the President of the Australian Clinical Psychology Association (ACPA). She has spent 20 years supervising Clinical Psychology trainees in Psychology Training Clinics at the University of Sydney, and prior to that at Macquarie University in Sydney. In these roles, Judy has been training supervisors for Clinical Psychology trainees for 13 years.



Professor Siân Coker is the Deputy Programme Director of a Clinical Psychology Training Programme, and the Postgraduate Research Director at a UK University. She has been involved in Doctoral level Clinical Psychology training for over 20 years. She chairs the National subgroup of Group of Trainers in Clinical Psychology (GTICP) for the Internationalisation of Clinical Psychology in the UK and her position on the BPS Committee of Trainers in Clinical Psychology (CTCP) reflects her expertise in this area. She is a Practitioner Psychologist registered with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC).

Professor Patrick W. L. Leung graduated with a MSc (Clinical Psychology) from the University of Hong Kong and a PhD from the University of Sheffield, UK. He joined CUHK in 1992. He is currently a Professor and the Chairman of the Department of Psychology. He is also a fellow of the Hong Kong Psychological Society. Before joining CUHK, he worked for more than 10 years as a clinical psychologist at a local children's hospital. His current research interests focus on psychopathology, particularly attention-deficit / hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and autism spectrum disorder (ASD), as well as on clinical trials of psychological intervention. He has published research papers in high-impact international journals such as the British Journal of Psychiatry and Journal of Child Psychology and Psychiatry.

Dr. Christian Chan is the chief examiner and associate director of the Master of Social Sciences in Clinical Psychology program at The University of Hong Kong. He holds a PhD in Clinical Psychology from the University of Massachusetts Boston. His research and clinical interests include disaster mental health, positive youth development, and the intersection of political and community psychology.

Dr. Roger Ng

Vice President of the Hong Kong College of Psychiatrists

Dr. Roger Man Kin Ng is a consultant psychiatrist and the Chief of Service of the Department of Psychiatry of Kowloon Hospital in Hong Kong. He was trained as a psychiatrist in Hong Kong and received training and supervision in cognitive-behavioural therapy (CBT) from the Beck Institute of Cognitive Therapy and Research in the US and the Oxford Centre for Cognitive Therapy. He is a fellow and a certified trainer/consultant of the Academy of Cognitive Therapy (US). He is also an honorary associate professor of psychiatry in the University of Hong Kong and the Chinese University of Hong Kong. He has extensive experience of supervising and training mental health professionals in the delivery of CBT in Greater China. He has been involved as the lead trainer of multiple national trials of CBT in Mainland China and published over 60 peer-reviewed articles in the field of CBT. Apart from his teaching and academic work, he is currently the Vice-President (General Affairs) of the Hong Kong College of Psychiatrists and the Secretary for Education, World Psychiatric Association. Promoting CBT in Greater China and other parts of the world is one of his action items in his work plan as the Secretary of Education in the World Psychiatric Association.

Ms. Anita Leung has been a legal practitioner for more than 25 years, advising both local and multinational companies on the full spectrum of both contentious and non-contentious intellectual property and information technology matters. Prior to joining David Lo and Partners as a consultant, Anita was a partner with two top international law firms in Hong Kong, Jones Day and Baker & McKenzie. Amongst many other positions held, Anita is an honorary fellow of the Hong Kong Academy of Pharmacy and has been appointed by the Chief Justice to sit on the Solicitors Disciplinary Tribunal Panel since October 2011.
